From here he worked for a forestry roading crew in Tapawera for a couple of years before moving back into the crushing industry with Waimea Contract Carriers for the next 31 years. He joined Edridge Crushing & Screening in 2015 at the age of 72 when they bought Waimea's crushing division.

His colleagues at Edridge's reckon there's pretty much nothing Jim doesn't know about quarrying and crushing rock. He is the go-to guy for any questions about how to run and how to fix the any of the crushing plant, and he's more than happy to pass his knowledge onto anyone who is interested. His current CoC was renewed a couple of years ago and he keeps himself up to date with the latest technology - his Cat 950M loader has a computerised Loadrite weighing system installed which means more accurate weights and less paperwork for Jim. Slope stability booklet now available


Our latest booklet on particular hazards - on slope stability in quarries and opencast mines- is now available.
