## **Driver sentenced to jail in Australia**

A bus driver who killed 10 people and injured 25 others in a crash in Australia's Hunter Valley last June has been sentenced to a maximum of 32 years in prison.

The 59-year-old Wedding bus driver had been impaired by the opioid Tamerol when driving too fast and engaging in risk-taking behaviour before the horrific crash.

While avoiding manslaughter charges, he was convicted of numerous dangerous driving charges.

The driver knowingly over-medicated and chose to drive under those conditions, putting countless lives at risk and destroying so many.

MinEx statistics on incidents with the potential to cause harm over the past 6 years show 29% of incidents (1,877 incidents) involve vehicles of which 924 result from vehicle collisions.



## You need to ensure that:

- 1. Policies and procedures for managing worker impairment are in place and ensuring no worker operates mobile equipment if impaired.
- 2. All workers are aware, and regularly retrained in the risks associated with operating machinery if impaired by drugs and alcohol, whether prescribed or otherwise.
- 3. All workers are required to disclose any medication they are taking that could impact their work.
