Production remains suspended at one of Australia's largest gold mines after part of a tailings dam collapsed over the weekend.

Newcrest Mining halted operations at the Cadia mine on Friday evening after the northern embankment slumped during a routine inspection.

As a precaution, Newcrest stopped depositing tailings into both of the mine's dams. The tailings material is a slurry of finely-ground rock, water and a low level of benign processing re-agents, which have been contained within the southern tailings dam.

Newcrest has secured the area around the tailings dam, and implemented a comprehensive geotechnical monitoring system.

"We are monitoring the impact carefully, and have observed no environmental damage. We believe there is no threat to personal safety," CEO and managing director Sandeep Biswas said in a statement this morning, noting the mine does not use mercury, cyanide, or arsenic for processing.

"We are actively engaging local landholders and residents downstream of the tailings facility, keeping them informed about what has occurred."

Regulators for the state of New South Wales have also been notified.



Biswas did not say how long suspension will stay in place, but said the suspension of operations is expected to have an impact on full-year guidance for production, capital, and costs, although it is too early to determine the extent.

Nor did he mention two earthquakes, each of magnitude 2.7, that occurred in the area a few days earlier. Last year, the mine was shut down for three months following a 4.3 magnitude earthquake.

Cadia, located in New South Wales, is the second largest open-cut mine in Australia. It produces more than 520,000 oz of gold annually, and around 57,000 tonnes of copper.
