
Ten Pathways to Death and Disaster

In *Ten Pathways to Death and Disaster* Professor Michael Quinlan (2014) identified a series of ten common catastrophic incident risk factors, known as the "Ten Pathways", contributing to major incidents in mining and other high hazard industries.

The Western Australian Government have analysed 71 fatality reports from the mining sector to assess the impact of these pathways and found the presence of some of these in every fatality.
