

New format, more benefits

For 2019, we've changed the format for our MinEx workshops. They now run in two half day sessions (on the same day). The focus will be on Operating and Safety systems, Emergency Management, Leadership and Legislation.

I'm also pleased to announce we will have an app to make it easy to

register/get information, handouts etc (this will be ready to go live in mid-December.

It's also great to have WorkSafe coming on board to co-host the workshops which will run from February to November - mostly two a month.

The first workshop will be run in Palmerston North on February 20, followed by: Blenheim Feb 25, Nelson Feb 26, there's workshops on March 12 & 20 in Waipukurau and Dunedin, Gisborne and Cromwell on April 10 and 17, Ashburton on May 1, Paeora and Rotorua June 5 and 6, Kerikeri and Dargaville on July 2 and 3, two workshops in Invercargill on August 20 and 21, Greymouth hosts on 19 September and the first in North Canterbury is held September 25, Hamilton hosts one on October 16 and Taumarunui gets its first on October 17, with Whakatane getting the last scheduled workshop on November 7. More details to come soon.

How to knock out your CPD



If you are a B-Grade CoC, which requires 8 hours of formal training in a year, the simplest way to clock up those hours next year is to attend one of MinEx's regional workshops.

Done and dusted.

If you are unable to get to one of those workshops, here's some other suggestions to achieve or at least contribute to your CPD hours in 2019.

- Attend conferences such as the QuarryNZ conference and <u>NZ Minerals</u>
 <u>Forum</u>
- Log in to **IOQNZ** Webinars
- Attend <u>IOQNZ</u> or <u>AQA</u> branch meetings and AGMs
- WorkSafe seminars
- Formal training through training providers.

Field trips can also earn you CPD hours. You can claim two field trips of two hours each year.



Worker health and dust

We are aware that the provision of simple-to-absorb information is a key requirement in our sector.

We've been working to produce booklets and fact sheets on single topics, designed for the smoko room or taking home. So far we've produced fact sheets on Respirable Crystalline Silicia (RCS), worker well-being, whole body vibration and drugs/alcohol. All of these are available to download here.



More recently we've produced a <u>booklet on Slope Stability</u> - copies available on request (<u>office@minex.org.nz</u>).

MinEx is producing more booklets and fact sheets in 2019. There will be booklets on Mental Health and Dust Management. A fact sheet on dealing with fatigue will be the first produced in the New Year.
