Water cart roll over

The operator of an articulated water cart reversed down a ramp with the spray bars turned on. The rear right tyre rode up a rock face approximately 600mm high and the truck body, with half a tank of water, tipped onto its right-hand side.

The operator tried to drive forward while the body was tipping, which caused the cab of the truck to tip to the opposite side. The operator was wearing a seatbelt and was not injured.

The contributing factors causing this incident were:

- reversing with water sprays on, impairing vision
- water cart was not required in this area
- operator engaged drive while tipping.

WorkSafe reviewed the site's incident investigation and concluded that "we are satisfied that you have taken the incident seriously and have made improvements to prevent a further recurrence."



You need to ensure that:

- 1. Areas where vehicles are not to go are sufficiently bunded to exclude access.
- 2. Operators of water carts do not reverse while water spays are operating.
- 3. Seatbelts are worn at all times in mobile equipment.
- 4. You report all significant injuries and near misses to WorkSafe and conduct a thorough investigation to avoid recurrence.
- 5. Operators are adequately trained and competent to operate mobile equipment in all circumstance and conditions.
